Presented by the Hong Kong Dance Alliance (HKDA) for the first time and sponsored by the Leisure and Cultural Services Department, the 'New Force in Motion' Series 2021 showcases the artistic ideas of local emerging choreographers in an enhanced format. Besides providing a professional platform and sponsorship to the new generation of choreographers, the series also encourages the development of various dance genres within the local dance scene with the aim of sparking creativity and diversity in choreography.

Produced by HKDA in the past, the series presented numerous talented choreographers including Rex Cheng and KT Yau (2017); Gabbie Chan and Jennifer Mok (2018); Joseph Lee, Terry Tsang and Tsang Wing-fai (2019); Chan Wai-lok, Sudhee Liao and Alice Ma (2020). Many of them went on to win awards at the annual Hong Kong Dance Awards, as well as being invited to conduct dance exchange and sharing around the world.

About Hong Kong Dance Alliance

Established in 1994, HKDA is a charitable organization, as well as the official organization from Hong Kong in the World Dance Alliance. With the mission of serving as a primary voice and support group for dance in Hong Kong and Hong Kong dance worldwide, its goals are to promote recognition, development, and mutual understanding of all forms of dance; facilitate communication and exchange among individuals and organizations; provide a forum to discuss dance-related matters; encourage dance research, education, criticism, creation, and performance; and, liaise, coordinate, and participate in activities with other dance organizations worldwide. Choreographer's Note

It all started when I saw the Egyptologists and forensic anthropologists in documentaries – their commitment to investigate ancient tombs and civilization, human remains and the past, their passion and perseverance in exploring the truth. Everyone must have experienced fondness and obsession for some people or something at some point.

Hong Kong is like sand slipping through our fingers.

From the social movement to the pandemic, my time of self-practice in dance has allowed me to rediscover my body and its senses. The emergence of substance in movement is natural yet fleeting, thus needs to be repeated and sought. This is the reason I am mesmerised by the studies of the body; I am arrested by the finess of my body's sensitivity. This piece is a foreshadowing through the exploration of the body:

thought I have found the right one
thought I have taken care to remember it
thought I cannot slip away
thought I possessed it
if what I have found cannot be held in my palms
if it is only an idea, an abstract construct, a faint memory
then is disappearance a choice
or the law of nature
life is circling

history is repeating

Hong Kong, what kind of history, value, spirit do you want to retain?

What do you want to remember?

In this short life, what have we invested our time and energy to understand?

What are we trying to find?





An art and theatre-maker focusing on art and cultural exploratory work. He is now running a cultural hub named HO BIT Goon.



In 2016, he was awarded the Best Sound Design from the Hong Kong Federation of Drama Society for his contribution to *The Revenge of Local Heroes*. He was also involved in the film scoring for the Hong Kong film, *Distinction* in 2018. Lai is currently a member of the Composer and Authors Society of Hong Kong, as well as a part-time tutor at The Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts.

Poon Chun-ho



Upon graduating from The Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts with a major in acting, he joined Theatre du Pif as a full-time actor trainee. In 2019, he received the Outstanding Actor Award at the 11th Hong Kong Theatre Libre with Castle of Glass, and has participated in various productions as Assistant to Director and movement director since then. Her works were presented in Sweden, Japan, Singapore, Shanghai, Guangzhou etc. She is currently a resident choreographer of Unlock Dancing Plaza.

Chan graduated from the Hong Kong Baptist University's School of Communication, and has represented the university's dance association in multiple competitions and performances. Later on, he continued to practice hip hop in Billy Chan Dance Concepts, and has participated in modern dance theatre productions, such as Freespace Fest's *Private Dances*, Hong Kong Arts Festival programme *The Trouble-maker's Concerto*, and the Autistic Genius musical *Good Times*. Chan is currently a member of the local dance group Strangers, with whom he won the What's up Doc Hip Hop Crew Battle. He is also the winner of the Hong Kong Street Dance Championships 2017 (Hip Hop) and Hip Hop Hooray 2018 (open class).






